| Year 9 | <p>Pupils study the key features of Crime and Punishment through time, examining how crimes, policing and punishment have evolved since medieval times. Pupils explore how different factors have impacted on crime and punishment through time including social change, the role of the government and changes in technology.</p> | | | <p>Pupils will examine the early reign of Henry VIII. They will examine the key features of his domestic and foreign policy looking at both their strengths and weaknesses. They will also explore the role of key individuals such as Thomas Wolsey, Thomas More and Thomas Cromwell in the running of the Tudor government. Pupils will gain an understanding of the decision taken by Henry VIII and his advisers to break from Rome and set up the Church of England, exploring not only why they did this but the implications it had domestically and internationally.</p> | | |
| Year 10 | <p>Pupils will examine the American West, Native American Culture and the movement of settlers West. Throughout this unit the pupils will explore the lives and practices of the Plains Indians, the conflicts between settlers and Plains Indians, and what life was like for those attempting to settle across America. Pupils will be required to complete a number of questions and exam style mocks throughout the unit.</p> | | | <p>Pupils will examine the changes in Germany between 1914 and 1939. They will investigate the birth of the Weimar Government, the early challenges it faced, and the year of recovery that followed 1923. They will then look at the birth of the Nazi party, its subsequent rise to power and how the Nazis consolidated their position up to 1939. The format this takes in lessons is that they will do content revision of key topics such as crime and punishment, Henry VIII, American West and Germany. The students have been supplied with revision booklets and guides both of which have a number of revision tasks to complete. The students will also complete a number of practice questions and mock exams in the build up to the exam tailored to what the teachers think are most likely to come up on the exam, and tailored to support any weaknesses the students might have.</p> | | |
